#### The History of Arbor Day

Arbor Day is celebrated on April 30th.

The first Arbor Day took place on April 10, 1872 in Nebraska. It was the brainchild of Julius Sterling Morton (1832-1902), a Nebraska journalist and politician originally from Michigan. Throughout his long and productive career, Morton

worked to improve agricultural techniques in his adopted state and throughout the United States when he served as President Grover Cleveland's Secretary of Agriculture. But his most important legacy is Arbor Day.

Morton (*photo, right*) felt that Nebraska's landscape and economy would benefit from the wide-scale planting of trees. He set an example himself planting orchards, shade trees and wind breaks on his own farm and he urged his neighbors to follow suit. Morton's real opportunity, though, arrived when he became a member of Nebraska's state board of agriculture. He proposed that a special day be set aside dedicated to tree planting and increasing awareness of the importance of trees. Nebraska's first Arbor Day was an amazing success. More than one million trees were planted.

A second Arbor Day took place in 1884 and the young state made it an annual legal holiday in 1885, using April 22nd to coincide with Morton's birthday.

In the years following that first Arbor Day,
Morton's idea spread beyond Nebraska with
Kansas, Tennessee, Minnesota and Ohio all
proclaiming their own Arbor Days. Today all 50 states
celebrate Arbor Day although the dates may vary in
keeping with the local climate. At the federal level, in 1970,
President Richard Nixon proclaimed the last Friday in April
as National Arbor Day.

# Beyond the Normal Eggplant Parmigiana Pizza

#### What You Will Need:

- 1 eggplant (about 1 pound), washed and sliced into rounds about 1/8 inch thick
- 1 cup tomato purée or pizza sauce
- 2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 tablespoons grated Romano cheese
- 8 ounces shredded mozzarella or 50/50 blend

Put the eggplant slices on a baking sheet. Brush with olive oil.
Broil or bake until the eggplant takes on some color and is just cooked through. Combine the tomato purée, garlic, oregano, basil and olive oil. Salt, to taste. Spread the sauce over the crust.
Arrange the eggplant slices over the tomatoes. Sprinkle on the grated Romano cheese, followed by the mozzarella.

<u>Chef's tip</u>: If you use small, firm eggplant, those without a lot of seeds, you don't need to salt and press the eggplant slices to rid it of bitterness that is common to some eggplant.

The first President to fly while in office was Franklin D. Roosevelt. In 1943, Roosevelt traveled on a Pan Am Transoceanic Clipper from Miami to Casablanca for a meeting with Winston Churchill. This was the first time an American President had

traveled on a plane while in office. Roosevelt was listed on the passenger manifest as Mr. Jones. In 1943, that transoceanic flight took 3 days.

Income taxes are usually due on April 15<sup>th</sup> from all employed Americans. If April 15<sup>th</sup> falls on a Saturday or a Sunday, the due date is extended to the next non-holiday weekday.

Income taxes have become such a common part of our lives, that it is hard to imagine that, at one time, there was no income tax in the U.S. When the

country was young, it struggled to raise funds from the 13 original states – \$15 million from each state in 1779 and more in following years.

The government collected the first income tax during the Civil War, but only temporarily. President Grover Cleveland tried to start up regular yearly income taxes in 1894, but the Supreme Court ruled it unconstitutional. For supporters of the income tax, that meant amending the Constitution, which the government finally did in 1913 with the 16<sup>th</sup> Amendment. From that point on, Congress could legally collect taxes on incomes.

Homer S. Cummings, Chairman of the Democratic National Committee during the administration of President Woodrow Wilson, counted the income tax as among the most notable accomplishments of the Democratic Party. The funds raised from it have been used for running many parts of the government. How much one pays depends on yearly earnings and certain deductions.

### **How Now Brown Egg**

Many people believe that brown eggs are a healthier choice than white eggs, but nutritionists disagree. The color of the egg depends on the




breed of the hen – chickens with red feathers and earlobes lay brown eggs; chickens with white feathers and earlobes lay white eggs. The difference is purely cosmetic.

### A 17 FOOT LONG CARROT?

Did you know that Carrots are a root vegetable that originated in Afghanistan? They were purple, red, white, and yellow, but never orange. Here are some other interesting facts:



- The Ancient Greeks believed the carrot made both men and women more amorous.
